CIRCULAR:-

Attention of the Principals of the affiliated College in the Faculty of Commerce and the Director, Institute of Distance Education is hereby invited to the Ordinances, Regulations and Syllabi relating to the Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.) (Accounting and Finance) degree course vide Pamphlet No.350 and to this office Circular No.UG/233 of 2003 dated 7th June, 2003 and No.UG/167 of 2004, dated 30th April, 2004 and they are hereby informed that the recommendation made by the Board of Studies in Accountancy at its meeting held on 19th July, 2004 has been accepted by the Academic Council at its meeting held on 7th August, 2004 vide item No.4.18 and subsequently approved by the Management Council at its meeting held on 13th August, 2004 vide item No.6 and that in accordance therewith, that Ordinance 5204 relating to the eligibility criteria prescribed for admission to the B.Com. (Accounting and Finance) degree course has been amended to read as under :-

G.5204 (a) A candidate for being eligible for admission to the Bachelor of Commerce (Accounting and Finance) Degree Course shall have passed XII Std. Examination of the Maharashtra Board of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent and secured not less than 45% marks in aggregate at first attempt (40% in case of reserved category).

(b) Every candidate admitted to the degree course in the constituent/affiliated college/recognised institution, conducting the course, shall have to register himself/herself with the University.

Further that Regulation 4283 regarding carry forward of internal marks at the B.Com. (Accounting and Finance) examination has been amended to read as under :-

R. 4283 Performance Grading – Passing Standard

(a) The performance grading of the student shall be of the seven point ranking system as under :-

No.	Division	Total Percentage Of Marks	Grade
I	I ---- I	65 or above	O
	I ---- II	60 ----- 64	A
II	II ---- I	55 ----- 59	B
	II ---- II	50 ----- 54	C
	II ---- III	45 ----- 49	D

The performance grading shall be based on the aggregate performance of internal assessment and semester end examination.

Student must get 40% marks in aggregate, i.e. 40% marks in Internal Assessment (i.e. 40% of 40 =16) as well as 40% marks in Semester End examination (i.e. 40% of 60 =24) separately, in order to pass the examination.

(b) Carry forward of internal marks :- A candidate who fails in any particular paper shall be allowed to reappear for that theory paper; however his/her internal assessment marks shall be carried forward.

(c) ATKT :-

- i) A candidate shall be allowed to keep terms for Semester II if he/she passes Semester I or if he/she fails in not more than two theory papers of Semester I.
- ii) A candidate shall be allowed to keep terms for Semester III if he/she passes Semester I and Semester II OR if he/she fails in not more than two theory papers of Semester I and Semester II taken together.
- iii) A candidate shall be allowed to keep terms for Semester IV if he/she passes in each of Semesters I, II and III OR if he/she passes Semester I and fails in not more than two theory papers of Semester II and Semester III taken together.
- iv) A candidate shall be allowed to keep terms for Semester V if he/she passes in each of Semesters I, II, III and IV OR if he/she passes Semester I and Semester II and fails in not more than two theory papers of Semester III and Semester IV taken together.
- v) A candidate shall be allowed to keep terms for Semester VI if he/she passes in each of Semesters I, II, III, IV and V OR if he/she passes Semester I and Semester II and Semester III and fails in not more than two theory papers of Semester IV and Semester V taken together.

Further that amended Ordinance 5204 and Regulation 4283 has been brought into force with effect from the academic year 2004-2005.
