Dr. Ned Bertz is an Assistant Professor in the Department of History at the University of Hawaii, and is currently in residence for a year as a visiting faculty member at Ambedkar University, Delhi. Since earning his Ph.D. in History from the University of Iowa in 2008, he has taught undergraduate and postgraduate courses on the history of South Asia, Africa, the India Ocean, world and transnational history, Indian popular cinema and literature, and the discipline of history, receiving two teaching awards along the way. His published research focuses on themes of nationalism, diaspora, race and urban space as they intersect in exchanges across the warm waters of the Indian Ocean. His next academic project concerns the transactional history of the impact of Partition around the Indian Ocean World.
