

Sub:- **Minor Research Projects/Seminars/Conferences/Symposia/Workshop.**

Following is a letter No. F.3-10/2007 (WRO), received from Dr. G. Srinivas, Joint Secretary, University Grants Commission, Western Regional Office, Ganeshkhind, Pune University Campus, Pune – 411 007 informing as under.

Sir/Madam,

(i) A college can avail itself of maximum five Seminars/Conferences/Symposia in one financial year. If more than five have been approved by UGC, the college is required to inform this office as to which, upto a maximum of five, this office would be sanctioning grants to maximum five proposals in order of the date of their receipt.

(ii) If a college has not settled accounts of UGC grants against all earlier Seminars/Conferences/Symposia, no grants will be sanctioned for any further such activity.

The Joint Secretary is requested to advise the colleges, that the teacher should be a permanent and aided/grantable (UGC pay scale). Further, the college has to be under section 2 (f) & 12 (B) of UGC act receiving salary grant from the state government.

He is also requested to ensure that proposals of only such above cases only be sent UGC. Further, there should be at least one year gap from completion of old MRP before taking new MRP by a teacher.

It may also be noted that if a teacher has an earlier/ongoing research project whose audited accounts are not submitted to the UGC, no further minor research projects will be approved/sanctioned unless and until the accounts of all earlier research projects are settled.
